

N.E.S.T. - Non-Elective Surgery Triage

The NEST criteria are required for scheduling non-elective surgery cases. The provider is responsible for determining and communicating the decision to incision time frame. The facility (OR and Anesthesia board runner) is responsible for determining how to accommodate the add on cases as quickly as possible and within the designated timeframes given.

NEST Level	Time Frame – Decision to Incision	Clinical Examples (these are guidelines only – based on the patient's acuity, the NEST level may not coincide with these examples)
NEST 1	Immediate/within minutes	• Uncontrolled hemorrhage from any site with hemodynamic instability • EDH with GCS < 8 • Airway compromise
NEST 2	Within 1 hour	• GSW neck/chest/abd without hemodynamic instability or airway compromise • TBI with GCS < 8 • Limb ischemia • Diffuse peritonitis • Perforated viscous • Abscess with severe sepsis or septic shock • Necrotizing fasciitis • Traumatic amputation above the wrist or ankle • Compartment syndrome • Irreducible joint dislocation associated with neurologic or vascular injury
NEST 3	Within 4 hours	• Incarcerated hernia containing bowel or bladder • Grade III open fracture • Complete bowel obstruction • Irreducible dislocation of major joint • Traumatic amputation between the digits and wrist or ankle • Deceased donor kidney transplant • Septic arthritis of major joint
NEST 4	Within 12 hours	• Partial bowel obstruction not improving • Appendicitis • Abscess w/o septic shock • Complex lacerations • Contaminated soft tissue injuries not involving fracture • Unstable pelvic fracture • Closed femur fracture
NEST 5	Within 24 hours	• Cholecystitis • Grade I or II open fracture (includes mandible fx) • Closed hip fracture • Closed fracture lower extremity long bone
NEST 6	Within 48 hours	• Biopsy got diagnosis • Organ procurement • Unstable acetabulum
Routine/Scheduled	Time & Space Available	• Closed fractures except above listed
